

Nettleworth Infant and Nursery School: Sport Funding 2020-2021

REVIEWED July 2021

For the period September **2020 to July 2021** the Government has allocated Nettleworth School **£17,396** to improve the provision of Physical Education (PE), sport & physical activity in Schools or pupils in years 1 & 2. This funding is provided jointly by The Department for Education, Health & Culture, Media & Sport & is allocated to all Primary Schools. This funding is ring fenced & therefore can only be spent on provision for PE & sport in schools. **We also carried forward from 2019-2020** the sum of **£2,638.40**. The total sport funding for **2020-2021 is £20,034.40**

The Department for Education state,

“Schools should use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport.”

The funding should be used to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers.
- Build capacity and capability within your school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

How should schools use the funding?




There are 5 key indicators that schools should use to measure improvements:



- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity (30 mins/day)**
- 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement**
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skill of all staff in teaching PE and sport**
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils**
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport**

The following plan shows how we are spending this allocation and how we aim to increase pupil participation in sports and PE ensuring sustainability through staff training alongside external providers.

Below are details of our School Sport Funding for 2020-2021, how it is being spent and the **intended impact** upon the children in our school.

<p>To use sport and PE as an intervention vehicle as part of our THRIVE intervention and TAKE FIVE programme to promote a positive impact on pupil mental health and physical wellbeing.</p> 	£766.50	Sept 2020 – July 2021	<p>Specialist THRIVE practitioners will have taken a lead on therapeutic well-being and physical play as an intervention, which will support pupil resilience and emotional well-being.</p> <p>TAKE FIVE resilience programme activities such as yoga, mindfulness breathing techniques will be embedded into whole school daily practice and support pupils mental health and wellbeing.</p>	THRIVE lead practitioners have supported staff with leading outdoor THRIVE and Take 5 intervention within class bubbles. This has positively impacted on the behaviour of our most vulnerable pupils with SEND.

Staff to participate in the lesson alongside the sports trainer.
